Dear GFWC Friends,

Our founder, Jane Cunningham Croly (1829-1901), earned her place in history through a lifetime of barrier-breaking work. First employed as a housekeeper by her brother John, a Unitarian minister, Jane launched her journalism career by writing a semi-monthly newspaper that she read to parishioners. By the age of 26, she was in New York writing about anything relating to "women's sphere in society" for various newspapers and magazines, including the *New York Tribune* and *Sunday Times*.

Known for her interest in women's welfare, Jane called for the first woman's congress in 1856 for a dialog on the changing role of women in society. A dozen years later she and 11 other women established Sorosis, a woman's club to "promote agreeable and useful relations among women of literary and artistic tastes," and to recognize "women of thought, culture and humanity everywhere, particularly when these qualities have found expression in outward life and work."

In the 1870s and 1880s, in many parlors large and small across a nation that was growing and changing, women were meeting to work together, learn from each other, and reach towards "higher aims," not only for themselves but for social improvement. In 1890, with Jane in constant communication with women's clubs across the country, Sorosis hosted a convention in New York City that culminated with women from 63 clubs acting on April 24 to establish the General Federation of Women's Clubs.

Today, with clubs across the U.S. and in several countries, GFWC members honor the spirit and vision of Jane Cunningham Croly each day with works that improve communities and enhance the lives of others through volunteer service.

As you gather together at your 2022 state conventions, I hope you will be inspired by Jane's story to continue to work towards "higher aims," through serving others and learning and growing from your experiences. And I hope that you will relish the "broader and nobler life" that Jane and her contemporaries often spoke of, as they blazed a new path for women such as you and me.

Congratulations to each of you and your clubs for your many successes in the past year, and good luck as you continue to work towards a better future for individuals and communities, near and far.

Cynthia Geis - GFWC Southern Region President

Cynthia's Federation journey began in 1990 when she joined the GFWC Heritage Junior Woman's Club in Huntsville, AL.

In 1994, she began serving on the GFWC Alabama Federation of Women's Clubs (AFWC) Board of Directors (BOD) as a member of the AFWC Junior Board (Special Projects Chairman). Subsequently, she served as the AFWC Director Elect of Junior Clubs (1996-1998) and Director of Junior Clubs (1998-2000). In 2000, she was elected as GFWC Alabama Treasurer and served in all elected officer positions (except secretary) through her 2010-2012 tenure as State Federation President. As GFWC Alabama President, Cynthia's President's Project was "AFWC Scholarships – Our Vision/Our Legacy," which increased the general scholarship endowment by 25 percent. She currently serves as the Chairman of the GFWC Alabama Resource Development Committee.



In addition to serving on the GFWC BOD as GFWC Alabama Director of Junior Clubs, State Federation President, and Region President, Cynthia served as the Home Life Special Projects Chairman (2000-2002), the GFWC Jennie Chairman (2012-2014), member (2014-2016 and Chairman (2016-2018) of the GFWC Signature Program Committee, and Chairman of the GFWC Elections Committee (2018-2020).

In 2014, she was elected as the GFWC Southern Region Treasurer and has served in all elected officer positions through her 2020-2022 tenure as Region President. As the Southern Region President, Cynthia selected "Putting Vision into Action" as a reminder that with our action we

achieve great things for our Federation, our communities, and ourselves. With the restrictions of the Covid-19 pandemic, some of the visions and consequent actions of our State Federations and International Affiliate Clubs have - by necessity – had to be refocused. However, in an amazing example of resilience and persistence, Southern Region clubwomen have continued "Living the Volunteer Spirit" as they have found innovative ways to meet and to serve the needs of their communities – both locally and globally – through their volunteer efforts.

Cynthia is a member of GFWC Legacy, the GFWC duMidi Woman's Club, and the GFWC Alabama Foster House Club. Additionally, she is a member of four national clubs – the GFWC Past President's Club (secretary), the GFWC Past Junior Director's Club, the GFWC Emeralds, and serves as "president for life" of the GFWC Condonsations. Cynthia is also a member of the National and Alabama Association of Parliamentarians.

A Huntsville native, Cynthia has been married to Gregg Geis for 45 years. Gregg, an honorary member of GFWC Alabama, is also a member of the GFWC Boosters and GFWC Alabama Foster House Club. Their son, Geoff, makes his home in Los Angeles, CA., with his wife, Jenna Heffernan, and their son Finn. Gregg and Cynthia are active supporters of the Huntsville Symphony Orchestra, the Huntsville Museum of Art, Burritt on the Mountain, and the Huntsville Botanical Garden. They are congregants at St. Thomas Episcopal Church, where Cynthia serves on the vestry and is Chairman of the Finance Committee. Cynthia is a 2019 graduate of Education for Ministry, a four-year distance learning certificate program in theological education, offered through The School of Theology at the University of the South at Sewanee.

In September 2018, Cynthia retired from the Department of Defense with 39.5 years of service. In her spare time, Cynthia enjoys reading, traveling, and spending time with family and friends.

- 4. Delegates will please wear their badges to all meetings.
- 5. A delegate wishing to speak, shall rise, address the chair and give her name and the name and the location of her club.
- 6. No delegate shall speak more than twice to a question, the second opportunity being granted only after every other delegate desiring the floor for the first time has spoken.
- 7. Debate shall be limited to two minutes per person. Extension of time may be granted by a twothirds vote of the voting delegates present and voting.
- 8. The timekeeper shall give a warning signal to each speaker. Time limit shall be adhered to.
- 9. All motions from the floor shall be presented to the Recording Secretary in writing when so required by the chair.
- 10. Resolutions and recommendations shall be in the hands of the respective committees at the opening of the morning meetings.
- 11. A resolution or recommendation cannot be debated until it has been referred to the proper committee and reported by that committee. No resolution can be voted upon until it has been read twice. A resolution with a minority report can be passed only by a majority of the convention.
- 12. A motion shall be carried by the majority vote of the voting delegates present and voting, except that a motion requiring a two-thirds vote shall be carried by a two-thirds affirmative vote of those present and voting.
- 13. The right to the floor may be granted to non-voting delegate members by the chair.
- 14. All questions concerning those entitled to vote shall be referred to the Credentials Committee.
- 15. The Convention shall be one meeting, recessing from session to session within the meeting.
- 16. Reports shall be filed with the Recording Secretary.
- 17. No one shall enter the Convention meeting room during a musical number or while a speaker is addressing the meeting.
- 18. The President shall appoint a Reading Committee to approve minutes of the entire Convention.
- 19. These rules shall be adopted or suspended by a majority vote, rescinded by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting, a quorum being necessary.




